







## **Training Announcement**

## "European Judicial Cooperation in the area of Cybercrime"

Bucharest, 22-24 June 2016

The Romanian Center for European Policies, together with the National Institute for Magistracy in Romania, the National Institute of Justice in Bulgaria, and the Center for Criminal Justice and Security Studies are organizing a training on "European Judicial Cooperation in the area of Cybercrime", dedicated to magistrates from Romania and Bulgaria.

The training will take place between 22nd-24th of June in Bucharest, Romania.

The main themes to be approached within the trainings are:

- 1. An introductory session (2 hours a day for 3 days) of Legal English Training focusing on specific terminology related to Judicial Cooperation and the area of Cybercrime
- 2. Presentation of the European institutions handling judicial and police cooperation and assistance at European level:

Short history of the evolution of European judicial cooperation

Examples of successful cooperation

3. Present methods used in cybercrime investigation:

Judicial channels

Police channels

COE CyberCrime Bureau

European mechanisms

Databases at European level

4. Cooperation with private partners:

The impact of illegal activities in the IT area, at individual and macro level.

5. The presentation of national laws and working procedures. Aspects of bi-lateral cooperation.

Trainers (TBC): Representatives of Romanian National Police – Cybercrime Department, liaison officers in Romania, Europol and Eurojust representatives, Information security companies, CERT-RO (Computer Emergency Response Team-Romania).

The final agenda will be communicated to training participants at a later stage.

All expenses of participants (travel, accomodation, subsistence) will be covered by the organizers.

The training is organized within the project "European Judicial Cooperation in the area of Cybercrime", co-funded by the Justice Programme 2014-2020 of the European Union.
