Specialised exchanges offer judges, prosecutors and court staff an in-depth training experience in their field of expertise in another EU Member State. Participants explore the judicial system of the host country with a special focus on the topic of the exchange, discuss common challenges and solutions, and cultivate their mutual trust for future cooperation.

Best practices observed by former participants are not only limited to their area of expertise but also extend to subjects such as digitalisation and use of technologies, cooperation with other professionals, communication to the parties and access to information.
