PROGRAMME

Objectives: The workshop is designed to provide trainers with a comprehensive understanding of the use of artificial intelligence in law enforcement within the European Union. It will examine the regulatory framework established by the EU AI Act, including its objectives, scope, and implications for law enforcement authorities, while highlighting prohibited practices, high-risk systems, and innovation mechanisms such as regulatory sandboxes. The programme also explores practical applications of AI in law enforcement, alongside the ethical, social, and fundamental rights considerations they raise. Finally, the workshop seeks to equip participants with effective methods for training and communicating complex legal and technical topics related to AI to diverse audiences.
