

LONG-TERM TRAINING PERIODS AT EUROJUST – 2027

Before applying, candidates are strongly advised to carefully review the long-term training General Conditions as well as the EJTN financial policy, which provide detailed information about the EJTN long-term training scheme.

1. Presentation

A total of 20 3-months long-term training periods will be implemented at the [European Union Agency for Criminal Justice Cooperation](#) (Eurojust) in The Hague, Netherlands. Eurojust is a specialised hub where national judicial authorities work closely together to fight serious organised cross-border crime. The role of Eurojust is to help make Europe a safer place by coordinating the work of national authorities – from the EU Member States as well as third countries – in investigating and prosecuting transnational crime.

During a long-term training period at Eurojust, the participants will be assigned to the National Desk of their Member State. They will be fully engaged in the daily tasks, handling operational cases and projects under the supervision of the National Member.

2. Length and available positions

- Number of placements: 20
- Duration: 3 months
- Training periods: the programme will be divided into three cohorts as follows:

3. Eligibility Criteria

The requirements to participate in the long-term training scheme at Eurojust are the following:

- Be a practicing prosecutor or judge (preferably investigative judge) in an EU Member State;
- Have practical experience dealing with international judicial cooperation in criminal matters, such as executing or issuing European Investigation Orders, European Arrest Warrants, or mutual legal assistance requests;
- Have at least three years of practical experience in the field of criminal law;
- Have a sufficient level of English to work in an international environment.

4. Supporting documentation

Participants are required to submit the following supporting documents in PDF format:

- 1) a curriculum vitae in Europass format, in English;
- 2) a cover letter in English (to be included in the application form).

These are the mandatory documents required by the host institution. Applicants are encouraged to submit any additional supporting documents permitted under the General Conditions that may strengthen their application and demonstrate their qualifications, experience and/or motivation.
